

Drug Misuse BBV Supplement (Part 2) Crib Sheet

- last updated: Thursday, 22 October 2009

All patients who have achieved a valid Drug Misuse claim will be eligible for this Local Enhanced Service.

All patients should have their injecting status recorded during the last **12 months**, and a red indicator is displayed because this has never been recorded. An injecting status of 'Never injected drugs' or 'History of previously injecting drug use' or 'Injected during the last 12 months' should be recorded.

For those patients who have **never** injected, **or** have **previously** injected, BBV discussion should be recorded during the last **12 months** and

Hep C testing should be recorded at **any time** prior to the audit date.

Patients who are currently **injecting** should have had 'BBV discussion' **and** 'Hep C testing' recorded during the last 12 months

Hep C testing can also be recorded on this screen. A record of any of the read codes from the Hep C testing section will be acceptable.

This patient now fulfils the criteria for BBV Supplement.

Below this, additional data is required for those patients who are HIV positive or have a chronic hepatitis infection, and this will also attract an additional payment.

Only those who have a record of HIV positive or have a chronic hepatitis infection will require a review and referral status to be recorded.

This patient had a Hep C antibody positive result and required Hep C PCR to be recorded. Recording that the patient is PCR positive means the patient has a chronic hepatitis infection.

Recording PCR positive alone will not include your patient in the chronically infected group, you must also record 'Chronic Hepatitis infection' and doing so will activate the indicators for review and referral status. Recording HIV positive would have had the same effect. The patient now has a record of a chronic infection.

A recap on the requirements:

For the BBV supplement payment, the patient should have **injecting status** and **BBV discussion recorded** during the last 12 months.

If Hep C testing is greyed out, it's because it is taken on trust that a patient who has already been diagnosed with a chronic infection has had the appropriate viral testing done.

For the additional chronically infected payment, you should **record a review and referral status** during the last 12 months.

For referral status you should record if a referral has been made – 'Yes', or 'Declined' or 'Already engaged'.

The data required for payment is now complete.
